Yellowhead Highway West (#16)

(90 km/hr max)
 West of Jasper, Highway #16 climbs over the lowest pass through the Rockies. It is a 4 hour drive to Prince George, a 5 hour drive to Kamloops, and a 6 hour drive to Fort St. James National Historic Site (p. 27).

Highway #93A

(60 km/hr max)
 Part of the original route to Banff, this quiet road rejoins the Icefields Parkway at Athabasca Falls, a half hour drive from Jasper. Highway #93A provides access to the Meeting of the Waters picnic area and the Mount Edith Cavell Road (#1). It's a great wildlife watching road -- look for moose. Open JUNE to OCT.

Miette Road

(60 km/hr max)
 This winding road up the Fiddle Valley leads to the Miette Hotsprings (#2), an hour's drive from Jasper. Stop at the Pocahonas Coal Mine Interpretive Trail and the Ashlar Ridge viewpoint along the way. Open MID-MAY to OCT.

Yellowhead Highway East (#16)

(90 km/hr max)
 This highway follows the centuries old route of the fur traders. Stop at the Disaster Point pull-offs, the Jasper House National Historic Site viewpoint, Talbot Lake, and the unusual Sand Dunes at Jasper Lake. It is a 4 hour drive from the Town of Jasper to Edmonton.

Maligne Valley Road

(60 km/hr max)
 Allow plenty of time to stop and take pictures on this scenic drive (#3-5). Maligne Lake is an hour's leisurely drive from Jasper. Watch for wildlife along the way.

Icefields Parkway (#93N)

(90 km/hr max)
 Built for leisurely sightseeing, the Parkway winds around mountains and climbs through high passes on its 230 km journey from Jasper to Lake Louise, and through scenes and experiences you'll never forget (#6-11). For more details, see the Icefields Parkway brochure.

Arrive early - campsites are available on a first-come, first-served basis only.
